Transcript

Subject:

At the "Mound" end there was a really nice playground with a castle and it was a brick castle, probably not to modern safety standards, but it was a great favourite with the children because it had windows that they could look through and you could climb on it and you could play Knights and Damsels.

That I remember as being a favourite place for our children and when they decided that they were going to demolish it our son wrote to the paper and he was then about five and the letter got printed.

So it was a very strong wish on his part to retain this special place. I think we went on playing there after that but it was not the same for him.
